Mode of Instruction Definitions

Accelerated: Accelerated programs are offered at a fast pace that condenses the time to completion. Students are able to complete a program with minimal disruptions to careers and other commitments.

Evening/Weekend: Courses meet on the UW–Madison campus only in evenings and/or on weekends to accommodate typical business schedules. Students have the advantages of face-to-face courses with the flexibility to keep work and other life commitments.

Face-to-Face: Courses typically meet during weekdays on the UW-Madison Campus.

Hybrid: These programs combine face-to-face and online learning formats. Contact the program for more specific information.

Online: These programs are offered 100% online. Some programs may require an on-campus orientation or residency experience, but the courses will be facilitated in an online format.

CURRICULAR REQUIREMENTS

Requirements Detail

Minimum Credit Requirement 33 credits

Minimum Residence Credit Requirement 18 credits

Minimum Graduate Coursework Requirement 27 out of 33 total credits must be in graduate-level coursework; courses with the Graduate Level Coursework attribute are identified and searchable in the university's Course Guide (<https://registrar.wisc.edu/course-guide> (<https://registrar.wisc.edu/course-guide/>)).

Overall Graduate GPA Requirement 3.25 GPA required.

Other Grade Requirements The Graduate School requires an average grade of B or better in all coursework (300 or above, not including research credits) taken as a graduate student unless conditions for probationary status require higher grades. Grades of Incomplete are considered to be unsatisfactory if they are not removed during the next enrolled semester.

Assessments and Examinations Two ancient language examinations and one modern language examination (or equivalent).

Thesis is required for students continuing to PhD.

Language Requirements

- General Greek language/literature examination
- General Latin language/literature examination
- Modern language examination in German or French and Italian, or equivalent coursework (e.g., German, French, or Italian for reading knowledge)

REQUIRED COURSES

27 credits out of 33 total credits in GREEK (<http://guide.wisc.edu/courses/greek/>) and LATIN (<http://guide.wisc.edu/courses/latin/>) must be completed in graduate-level coursework.

- 6 credits must be completed in graduate seminars, including 3 credits in pro-seminar (CLASSICS 900 or equivalent as approved by Director of Graduate Studies)
