

CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION: SECONDARY MATHEMATICS EDUCATION, M.S.

This program is a named option in the Curriculum and Instruction M.S. (<https://guide.wisc.edu/graduate/curriculum-instruction/curriculum-instruction-ms/#textcontainer>)

The secondary mathematics program is a streamlined, graduate-level program which prepares students for a teaching license both in a specific content area at the secondary level (grades 4-12) and to work with English language learners (ESL certification). The program spans two summers and an intervening academic year. Throughout this time, students take graduate-level courses and engage in fieldwork associated with those courses. To earn the degree, students must complete a master's project.

Candidates may apply for more than one content area. However, they will only be allowed to enroll in one area at a time.
