ELEMENTARY EDUCATION: KINDERGARTEN - 9TH GRADE

REQUIREMENTS

REQUIREMENTS

The core program in Elementary Education requires 60 credits of professional coursework in addition to other degree requirements. Students are certified to teach kindergarten through grade 9 (K-9) and can also teach at the 4K level.

The option coursework listed here is one component of the Elementary Education, BSE degree (https://guide.wisc.edu/undergraduate/education/curriculum-instruction/elementary-education-bse/#requirementstext) requirements.

PROFESSIONAL SEQUENCE

The professional coursework was designed to be completed in four semesters, starting in the fall after admission to the program. Each semester of the sequence must be followed sequentially and taken in consecutive semesters unless a modification is approved. Most classes must be taken during specified semesters, while the scheduling of other requirements is more flexible; some may be completed prior to beginning the sequence.
