### SAMPLE FOUR-YEAR PLAN

This Sample Four-Year Plan is a tool to assist students and their advisor(s). Students should use it—along with their DARS report, the Degree Planner, and Course Search & Enroll tools—to make their own four-year plan based on their placement scores, credit for transferred courses and approved examinations, and individual interests. As students become involved in athletics, honors, research, student organizations, study abroad, volunteer experiences, and/or work, they might adjust the order of their courses to accommodate these experiences. Students will likely revise their own four-year plan several times during college.

#### Total Credits 120

- Students following *Classics with emphasis in Latin* will continue the Latin sequence and begin the GREEK 103 Elementary Ancient Greek sequence; students following *Classics with emphasis in Greek* will continue the Greek sequence (GREEK 305 Intermediate Greek fulfills L&S Literature Breadth requirement) and begin LATIN 103 Elementary Latin sequence.
- Students following *Classics with emphasis in Latin* will continue the Latin sequence and take GREEK 104 Second Semester Greek; students following *Classics with emphasis in Greek* will continue Greek sequence (GREEK 306 Intermediate Greek fulfills L&S Literature Breadth requirement) and take LATIN 104 Elementary Latin.
- Students following *Classics with emphasis in Latin* will continue the Latin sequence (LATIN 301 Latin Literature of the Roman Republic fulfills L&S Literature Breadth requirement) and take GREEK 305 Intermediate Greek; students following *Classics with emphasis in Greek* will continue the Greek sequence (except for GREEK 505 Elementary Prose Composition, all 500-level GREEK courses fulfill L&S Literature Breadth requirement) and take LATIN 203 Intermediate Latin.
- Students following *Classics with emphasis in Latin* will continue the Latin sequence (LATIN 302 Latin Literature of the Roman Empire fulfills L&S Literature Breadth requirement) and take GREEK 306 Intermediate Greek; students following *Classics with emphasis in Greek* will continue the Greek sequence (except for GREEK 505 Elementary Prose Composition, all 500-level GREEK courses fulfill L&S Literature Breadth requirement) and take LATIN 204 Introduction to Latin Literature.
